Information about the corona vaccination

Dear Mr. John Doe / dear Mrs. Jane Doe,

The vaccinations against the corona virus have now started. The central vaccination center for the district of Tübingen was set up in the Paul-Horn-Arena in Tübingen and began vaccinations on 4th January 2021.

The vaccination takes place step-by-step according to prioritisation. In a first step, people who have reached the age of 80 will be vaccinated.

Important for you:

There will be no personal invitation to be vaccinated.

This means that you have to arrange a vaccination appointment yourself (if you are interested).

A vaccination at the Tübingen vaccination center is only possible by appointment. You can make this either by telephone on 116 117 or online via the state portal Baden-Württemberg.de (<https://www.impfterminservice.de/impftermine>). Here you can also get all information about vaccinations. You can find the answers to the most important questions in the attachment as well. The important information can also be found translated on the municipal website www.rottenburg.de.

Of course, the corona vaccination is voluntary. However, the Federal Ministry of Health has issued a strong vaccination recommendation to protect yourself.

Questions and answers about the Tübingen vaccination center

1. What are the opening hours?

Daily from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m., during these times appointments can be made via the number 116 117 or at www.impfterminservice.de.

2. How do I register?

- Registration is strictly necessary. This is done centrally via the number 116 117, the app of the same name or via the central registration platform (<https://www.impfterminservice.de/impftermine>).
- You have to actively take care of an appointment if you belong to the specified target group, there will be no personal letter.
- Because two appointments within 21 days are necessary for the vaccination, the second appointment must be agreed at the same time. The second appointment is absolutely necessary because only then is vaccination protection guaranteed. The period of 21 days should not be significantly exceeded.
- When making an appointment, you will receive a 12-digit code that you must bring with you to the two vaccination appointments.
- This can sometimes be a challenge for some elderly people. In this case, it is helpful to involve relatives in the appointment process.
- Accompanying persons can be with you at the vaccination appointments.

3. Is the vaccination center accessible?

Yes, the vaccination center is barrier-free and just like that designed inside. There are for example broadened vaccination booths for wheelchair users. A limited number of wheelchairs are available on location.

4. What do I have to consider when making an appointment? What documents do I have to bring with me?

Please only come to the vaccination appointment if you feel healthy. You can bring an accompanying person with you if necessary. It is mandatory to wear a full-face mask on the entire site. What you have to bring along:

- Appointment code that you received when you registered online or when you registered by telephone
- Identity card or passport (after consultation with the district vaccination center, the birth certificate, driver's license or health insurance card will suffice if, for example, you no longer have an identity card)
- Health insurance card (if you are insured by the statutory health system)
- Vaccination certificate
- If possible, the already completely filled information sheet (see attachment)

5. Does the vaccination have to be paid for on location?

No, the vaccination is free of charge regardless of the insurance status.

Please remember to bring your health insurance card with you in any case!
